[1] A person of at least 15 years of age who is employed and who is paid for their work as a salaried worker, official, entrepreneur or freelance worker.

[2] An unemployed person is a person who does not work, has been registered as unemployed by a regional unit of the Labour Market Board and who is seeking work (in accordance with § 2 3) of the Labour Market Services and Benefits Act).

[3] A long-term unemployed person is a person who has not been engaged in work or an equivalent activity for a period of at least 12 months. People between the ages of 16 and 24 are classed as long-term unemployed if they have not been engaged in work or an equivalent activity for a period of at least 6 months (in accordance with § 10 5) 7) of the Labour Market Services and Benefits Act).

[4] People who do not work and who are not actively seeking work (incl. students, pensioners, people on parental leave, those who have difficulty finding work, the disabled and people who are non-active for other reasons).

[5] Working-age people who have been diagnosed as having a disability or for whom a rehabilitation plan has been drawn up on the basis of the Social Benefits for Disabled Persons Act or who have been diagnosed as incapable of working on the basis of the State Pension Insurance Act.
